

⇒ **Student Services**

- 57 schools receive Title I funds, including charter and alternative
- 72.1% of students are eligible for free and reduce-priced meals
- 16.4% of students receive special education and supports
- 7% of students participate in the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Program



⇒ **Transportation and Food Services**

- Approx. 28,000 students transported daily on 209 bus routes from 2,200 stops
- 3.8 million miles traveled per school year
- 44,000 meals served daily (approximately)

⇒ **Budget – FY 2018-19**

- \$505.2 million General Fund Budget

 - Of the 197 students enrolled, 169 received the IB diploma—86%
